

## “Go Mean; GO” - Foreshadowing

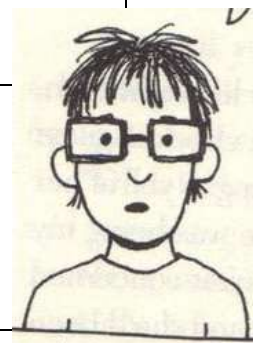
- Use of indicative words/phrases and hints that set the stage for a story to unfold and give the reader a hint of something that is going to happen without revealing the story or spoiling the suspense.
- An advance sign or warning of what is to come in the future.

In “Go Means Go,” Junior’s mother foreshadows that his school transfer from Wellpinit to Reardon will not be easy. She says, *“You’ll be the first to ever leave the rez this way, the Indians around here are going to be angry with you”* (47).

1. Do you think that Junior’s mother is correct? Why would the Indians be angry with Junior for transferring schools?
